As you can read on our special report, our experience in Ghana was very effective and fruitful. We took some steps of faith and God met us with His provision and power.



Now I am stepping out in faith again to take the grace message to 600 pastors in India in January. These pastors have been introduced to the grace message and want to know more about it. The first conference will be in Kakinada on the southeast coast, the second in Hyderabad in south central India.

My previous trips to India have shown me that pastors and evangelists are in tremendous need of training—and that is an understatement! With our grace teaching, we meet a great need, equip them for ministry, and “fire the first shot” that wins the battle for the gospel of grace.

The trip has its challenges. Indian government and religious groups are not friendly to the gospel, so we will have to be discreet in our efforts. I have asked my friend Dale Taliaferro, president of Equipped for Life Ministries, to help in the conferences. He is an excellent teacher. The trip also involves in-country travel which takes more time and money. Right now, the biggest challenge is raising the \$7500 budget for both conferences. In the meantime, I have a busy fall of church

meetings and conferences. I hope you can drop in on one in your area. I would also appreciate your prayers as I continue to bring the gospel of grace to the unsaved and the grace of the gospel to the saved. Thanks, and God bless you!

In August, Charlie also spoke at **St. Francis Protestant Fellowship** (Fort Worth) and **Victor Street Bible Church** (Dallas).

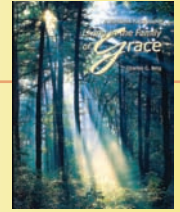

Now . . .

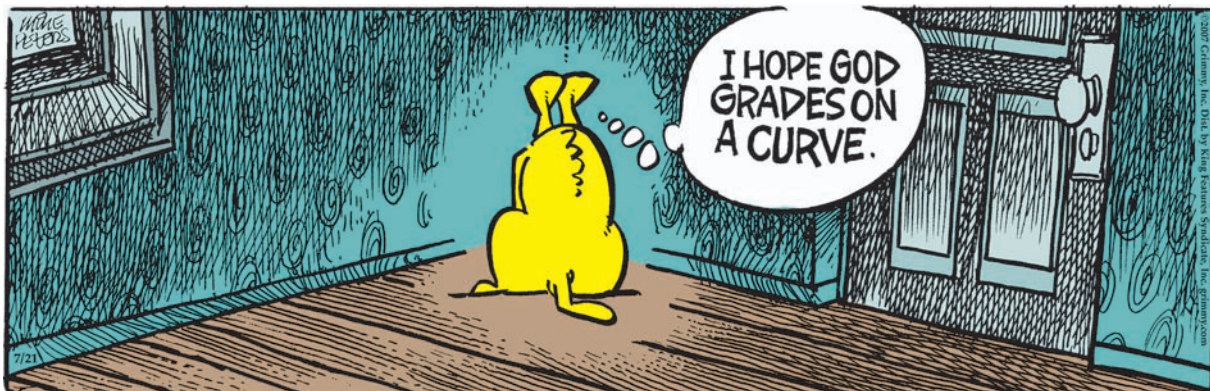

TEAM REPORT



Thank you for supporting our team mission to Ghana, West Africa. This year, we ministered in two cities with conferences for church leaders, training for women leaders, small group discipleship, and outreach in the schools and community. We also indirectly brought the grace message to a second country, Burundi in east Africa, by bringing to our training Pastor Anicet Ndikuryo who returned to his country to teach the leaders of his 18 churches. Below are some reflections from various people involved with the trip.

In their native tongue, the women sang a praise and thanksgiving song to Jesus for our ministry there. No accompaniment, no hymnbook — just the most



beautiful harmony you have ever heard this side of heaven. I never wanted it to end — but then, in heaven, it never will! We cherish those lovely women. God knitted our hearts together and we will not be the same again. Thanks so very much for all of you who prayed for and supported us.
