Fishing for Fish and Men...


A new book!




An excerpt from Fishing for Life:

That's why when I take others fishing, I do my best to make sure they feel the tug and catch fish. Bad experiences can cause us to abort many endeavors in life. I think of my experiences as a boy going to church and memorizing Bible verses and creeds. It all felt empty, so I quit religion—until I felt the Tug. I later discovered that God hadn't quit me."

The coronavirus


